Cutting Instructions

	Quantity	Size
Background - White	1	5 ¾ " square
	4	4 ½ " squares
Fabric A	1	5 ¾ " square
Fabric B	1	5 ¾ " square - sub cut along the diagonal - 2 triangles
	6	2 ½ " squares
Fabric C	1	5 ¾ " square - sub cut along the diagonal - 2 triangles
	6	2 ½ " squares

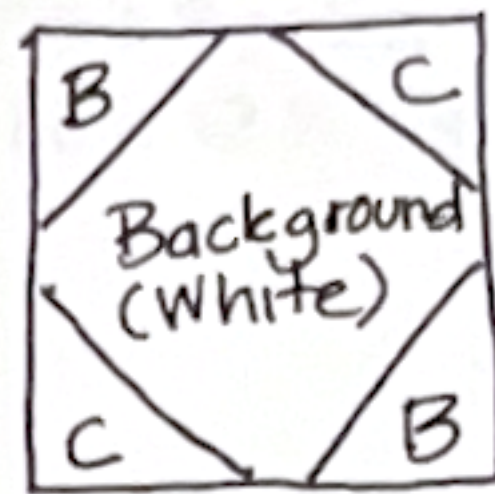
Draw the stitching lines:

- Draw diagonals on the backside of all 2 ½ " squares
- On the 5 ¾ " Background square - draw stitching line ¼ " away from each of the two diagonals
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The sewing instructions on the YouTube is fabulous! These are primarily for those who don't feel comfortable/have access to the video - they are in no way as great as the designer's instructions

Stitching unit A :

Place 2 - 2 1/2" squares Fabric B on 4 1/2" square of background, opposite corners, stitch on diagonal. Trim and press toward Fabric B. Do likewise with fabric C on the same background square. Make 1.

Stitching unit B:

On remaining 4 1/2" squares - place a 2 1/2" square in one corner, stitch along diagonal, trim and press away from background - make 2 with Fabric B and 2 with Fabric C. You will have 4 units

→ 2 w/ Background & C

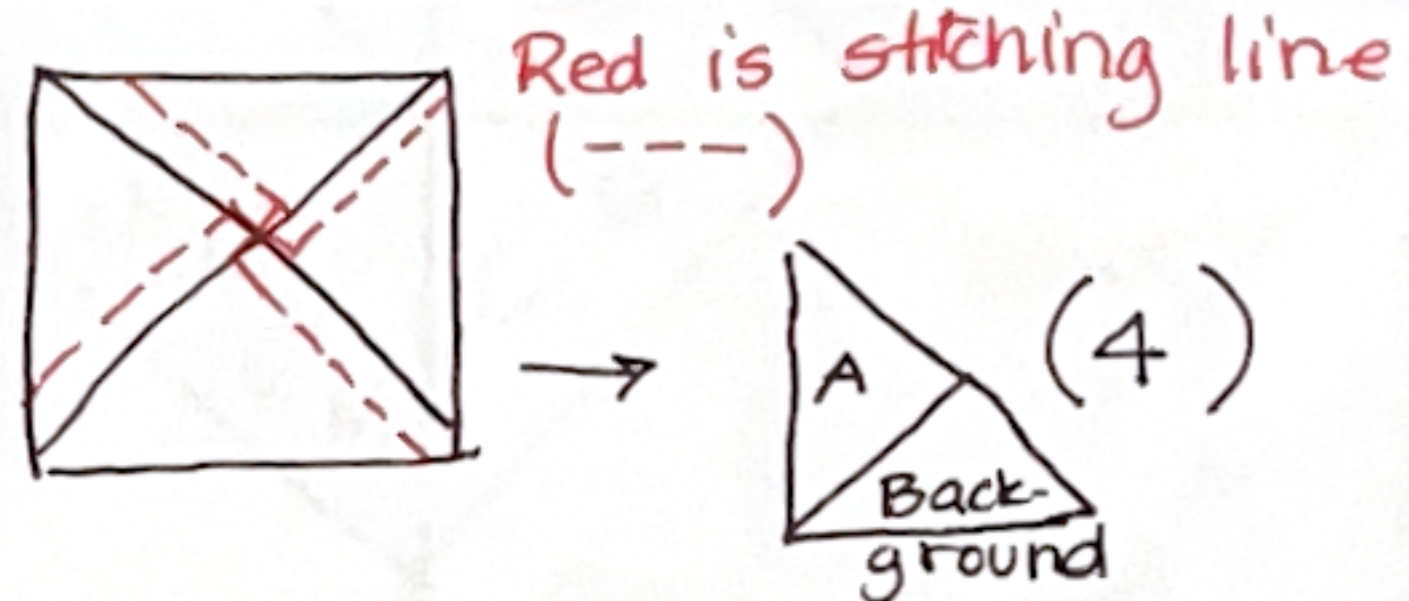
Stitching unit C:

Starch is your friend!! Stabilize the bias.

Step 1: With right sides together, sew background and fabric A (5 3/4" squares). Stitch on the right side of diagonal unit middle, needle down, turn, stitch to the left side of diagonal, stitch. Do likewise on the other diagonal (this will guarantee correct orientation). Cut along diagonals, you will have four triangles

Step 2: right sides together the triangles (fabric B and C) and units made in step one., B and C will be bigger - line them up using square corner as a reference. Stitch, press open, trim resulting square to 4 1/2" - you will have 4.

Step 3: With remaining 2 1/2" squares, place in corner of B and C - using the other fabric (B to C; C to B). Stitch along diagonal, trim and press.



→ B or C 4 total



→ Cor B
→ B or C

Assemble Block : now you have nine units to assemble like a 9-patch - I like seams pressed open, but use method you prefer - the resulting block will be a 12 1/2" square.
