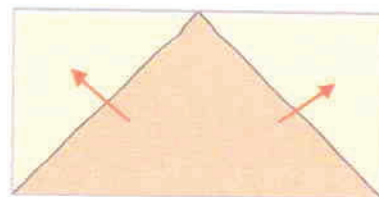


Making the Flying Geese Blocks Using the No Math Method

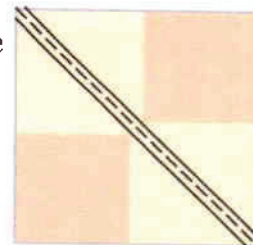
For the Test Block, Assemble:

- (1) 5-1/4" Any colored square for the geese
- (4) 2-7/8" Background squares for the wings

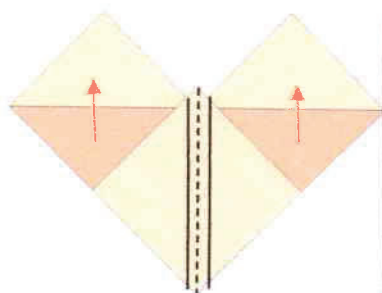


If you have never used this method before, make a test block first. Resist the temptation to round up the small blocks to 3". It won't work. However, your test block may indicate that a scant 1/4" seam works better for you. If you are using the [Lazy Girl No Math Ruler](#), the size we are making is size "F", 2" x 4" finished, (which is 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" unfinished.)

Place the two small 2-7/8" Background squares on opposite edges of the large colored geese square, *right sides together*. Draw a diagonal line through the squares, then sew 1/4" away from both sides of the line.



Cut on the line. Press toward the cut squares, making two blocks which look like hearts.



Place a 2-7/8" Background square face down on the heart with the point overlapping the middle. Draw a line on the diagonal of that square and sew 1/4" on either side of the line. Cut these apart, pressing to the heart again.

You will have four flying geese blocks that require no trimming except to cut off the dog ears. If you like your sample, make the Flying Geese noted below. If not, adjust your seam allowance and try again.

Making the 96 Flying Geese Blocks

Assemble:

- (96) 2-7/8" Background squares for the wings
- (6) 5-1/4" Pomegranate on Navy squares for the geese
- (6) 5-1/4" Scallops on Navy squares for the geese
- (6) 5-1/4" Red Leaf Blender squares for the geese
- (6) 5-1/4" Red Pomegranate Blender squares for the geese



Scallops on Navy

Following the directions above, make (24) of each color of the Flying Geese blocks. Press and square-up to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2".
